Make your own sprinkler (housingaforest.com/sprinkler-fun) from a spare water bottle.




Experiment with colors and heat absorption using construction paper, ice and the sun (teachengineering.org/activities/view/colors_absorb_heat_better).

Make a card for or write a letter to a friend, family member or senior citizen.




Start a neighborhood recycling contest to see who can reuse/recycle the most material.





Build a blanket fort in your living room.















